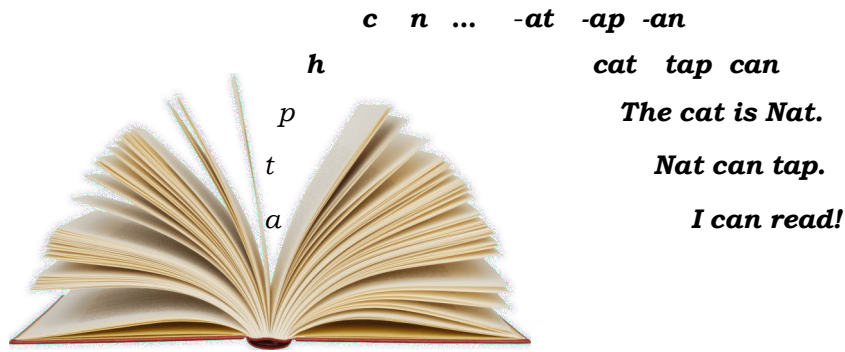

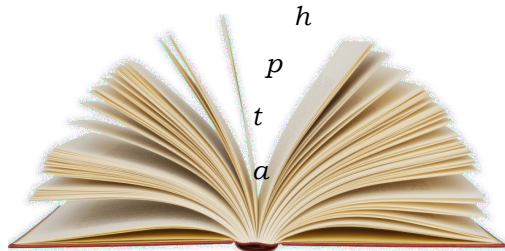
Course Description:

SEE is an International Multisensory Structured Language Education Council (IMSLEC) accredited course utilizing structured, multisensory language instruction based on the SEE approach for teaching reading, decoding, reading comprehension, reading fluency, spelling, handwriting, written expression, grammar, and auditory discrimination & memory. While designed for learners age 5 to adult diagnosed with dyslexia or at-risk for dyslexia, the SEE program can also support emerging learners and/or learners struggling to read, write, and spell. SEE can also integrate with Montessori methods for those who teach in a Montessori classroom.

Upon successful completion of this course, participants with a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution will be qualified to sit for the ALTA National Competency Exam and become a Certified Academic Language Practitioner (CALP).
